

DARRA UNITING CHURCH BUILDING 90TH ANNIVERSARY

Saturday afternoon 2 August brought together nearly 90 people to hold a Service of Thanksgiving for the 90th birthday of the building used as the worship centre at Darra. It was originally opened on 9 August 1924 as a Methodist Church.

The Service was led by Pastor Charles Greer and the special Commemorative Address was given by Rev John Mavor, A.M., a former Minister of Oxley-Darra Methodist circuit during the years 1958-1960.

Sections of the Service described as "What Darra meant for me" were led by the Rev Burt Johns (also a former Minister there from 1982-1991) and Mr Ken Whyte, a young leader at Darra during Rev Mavor's ministry. A third section entitled "What Darra means to me" was led by Mr Sang Vo, the secretary of the Darra Vietnamese Congregation which now uses the Darra building for worship.

The Vietnamese Young Adult and Youth Choir presented a stirring item in song.

A happy time of fellowship and reminiscing took place in the Hall afterwards. A commemorative booklet tracing some of the history of the past 90 years and more is available on sale for \$5 a copy. Please see Harry Thompson if you would like to purchase one or more copies.
