Weekly reflection

Mobilising Mission (2)

Today we enter – at least in our minds – the gates of Jerusalem. We are near the end of our Lenten journey. Palm Sunday – the beginning of what might be called the worst week in human history! And yet now we are in the crowd singing and shouting Hallelujah, as we watch Jesus ride a donkey / colt down the street. Imagine for a moment that you are the colt? What a mission? You're minding your own business – probably a little bored being tied up to a fence but happy enough. Then along comes these guys who untie you with words something like: "Come on – have we got a job for you!" So, you're led to Jesus who wants to ride you into Jerusalem. You get to be the carrier of none other than Jesus. And then those feelings of joy as you get bombarded with palm leaves and clothes to tread upon. You don't know what's coming! And you are totally unaware that once inside those gates, you will be forgotten. For now, though, you are intent on giving this 'rider' the best ride possible. It's better than being tied to a fence!

God needs us to be a mission mobiliser of His mission for Him. He comes into our life, unties us from the fence of our normal routines and gives us the chance to carry His message into unchartered places. Often His mission takes us where we've never been, to do what we've never done. And the good news is that He shows us how to embrace that chance / challenge. As Paul urges, "have this attitude in yourselves, which was also in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 2: 5). That attitude is one of humble obedience. Are we prepared to be the Colt for Jesus? To carry His message – not thinking of ourselves and what we can gain but what it can be and do for others around us? Be Blessed
