Weekly reflection

DIVINE INTERVENTION?

Those of you familiar with the story of Joshua may know that he was a great leader and a great warrior. But more than that he possessed an intimate relationship with God. Chapter 10 reveals this perhaps more than any other chapter. Joshua and his team were up against it. Yet God had promised victory to them over their adversaries. In the natural it was a disaster. In the spiritual – just routine for an all-conquering, all loving, all knowing, ever present God. Verse 12 – 14 reveals a miracle of such magnitude that it will never be repeated. Imagine, if you can, the Sun stopping its movement at midday and for the next 24 hours it stays still. No night! WOW! Joshua prays (v. 12) and seeks God's power over his own creation and God obliges – because God can. In essence Joshua in his heart knows he needs more 'light' to bring about a total victory and thinks – God can do this – and he does – divine intervention.

Jesus reveals centuries later that He is still in control of every dimension of His Creation – which includes you and I. Mark 4 records the familiar episode of Jesus calming the waters. For me, the significance of that account is not only that Jesus reveals yet again his power, but that he rebukes the Disciples for being afraid and lacking faith (Mark 4: 40). Could not / should not have the disciples invoked the same – faithfulness and sought divine intervention? What about you and I? When we are confronted with seemingly impossible situations are we afraid and panic or can we put on our 'Joshua Armour', activate our faith, trust our relationship with God - who has our back no matter what - and pray believing for divine intervention? Of course, such intervention can only come through a total dependence on the presence and power of the Holy Spirit.
