Pastor's Ponderings!

As most would know today is American Independence Day – the day which commemorates the inauguration of the United States of America on 4th July 1776. Independent, presumably because instead of being 13 colonies all with their own policies and procedures, they united under one Constitution! Most Americans seem to celebrate this day as being special and yet I often wonder if independence is always the ideal! We encourage our kids for example to become independent, yet we don't want them becoming so independent that they ignore our counsel, or even worse, ignore our presence altogether. Yet we certainly do not want them to be dependent on us forever either. So, what is the solution.

I think Jesus gives us the answer as He sends out His disciples to go, grow other disciples. Jesus sends them with instructions that essentially says: avoid excess baggage, use time wisely and respond positively to the challenges you find (Mark 6: 7-12). What he is suggesting, I believe, is that in our going (becoming independent) we are not to run off without His counsel. He (Jesus) still knows what is best and if we take stock of His words and obey them, we will succeed. It seems to me that neither independence nor dependence is appropriate as we grow in Christ - being prepared to be sent into the world in which we live to make a difference. Interdependence – or being mutually reliant on, and committed to, each other - then must be our approach! Jesus depends on his church (that is you and me) for the ongoing spread of His message of hope, love, and transformation, and without absolute dependence on Him – we will fail in His commission for us.
