PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

TAKING COURAGE!

Let me tell you a true, but humorous and slightly scandalous story that comes out of the early days of the church. I read this a few weeks back and yes, its out there, but I was caught by the message. How courageous are we to really live our lives in submission and obedience to Jesus? To say with Isaiah - "here am I, send me" (Isaiah 6: 8). When the father of Origen, a third century theologian, was arrested for being a Christian, Origen, then only 17, was aflame with the desire to follow his Dad and share in glorious martyrdom. His mother pleaded with him not to go, but the headstrong boy did not want to listen to reason. His quick thinking mother did what she could. She hid ALL his clothes. Though Origen stormed and protested, she wouldn't reveal where they were hidden. He couldn't leave the house, and so he was unable to volunteer for martyrdom. Isn't it interesting? Origen spoke courageously (to be martyred), but lacked the courage to 'put it all on the line'. Stepping outside without clothing would have sped up his arrest and imprisonment, and thus his desire to follow his father, but it was a step too far.

In a sense, I suspect that talking with a friend - or perhaps worse an unknown bystander - about our faith is, for many of us, the equivalent of going outside naked. It makes us uncomfortable. We feel exposed. We declare that we will follow Jesus , maybe even give our lives for him, but to risk being embarrassed or rejection or abuse for him seems to be beyond our level of discipleship. Jesus meets his disciples and issues a challenge which would have seemed presumptuous at best and rude at worst. Go throw out your nets and catch some fish (Luke 5: 4). What are our fishing buddies going to think? We will be utterly embarrassed as if being out all night and catching nothing is not bad enough! Yet, Peter, the spokesperson for these same men responds being willing to forsake everything to follow Jesus even if it meant losing the esteem of their friends. God spoke through the prophet Haggai - "take courage and My Spirit is abiding in your midst; do not fear" (2:5). Lets take courage!
