

PASTOR'S PONDERINGS



THE MAIN GAME....

Occasionally God brings across your path someone who speaks into your life in ways that you do not expect. They emerge onto the scene and although there appears little in common initially, a strange bond develops and is rarely forgotten. One such person crossed my path while in Gympie and what this person has taught me is truly mind shattering. Lyn (not her real name) is Indigenous – a tribal elder of her own people, a constant voice for the culturally diverse, the impoverished, the down and outs of society and one who possesses a determined spirt such that I had not come across before. We didn't speak that often but when we did – I knew I had better pay attention and listen, and despite the infrequency. we shared numerous moments of both triumph and trauma! I met her for coffee on one occasion and asked her a little of her story and what kept her going when she got so many knockbacks! She shared with me that she is a part of the 'Stolen Generation' – having her parents being forcibly removed from her as a young girl, having to find her own way in life as an unwanted black girl! There was lots more she shared; yet it was what she said in response to the second question that has stuck with me ever since. What keeps me going, fighting for reconciliation (she added) is simple. "You gotta know what your main game is and you gotta make sure your main game remains your main game - no matter what".

In a world where there are so many distractions that vie for our attention, our access, our money, and our time, we, as Christ followers need to know what our main game is and make sure we keep the main game – the main game! Put another way – we need to ensure that Jesus is preeminent in our lives, that He is our top priority meaning we spend time with Him, seek after Him, honour Him and love Him as He loves you! Today we are asked the question that Jesus asked Peter: "Do you love me more than these"? (John 21: 15).
