#### **MUM'S & MISSIONARIES!**

It's Mother's Day! It's also a day to hear two special missionaries as they head off soon to Cambodia. Both are cause for celebration! Yet both bring an element of sadness! It's a day that, for the majority, we pause for a moment and remember our Mum's, thanking them for the sacrifices they made for us. Mothers give so much of themselves with no thought of reward or gain but simply to provide the best they can for those they have carried, fed, nurtured, loved, disciplined, - their sons and daughters. That's just what Mums do. Their choices, while often bearing personal cost, only bring praise and gratitude for who their son or daughter becomes. Paul recognizes the value in generational insight and teaching from our Mums, Grandmas and Great Grandmas (2 Timothy 1: 5). What a blessing! What a gift - in presence, in solidarity, in advice, in affirmation, in praise, in encouragement – with intention, with passion, with purpose, with anticipation, with hope, and by a force that is often beyond themselves! In the words of a colleague of mine some years back, "Mothers just do what they need to do, go where they need to go, be who they need to be, and give what they need to give."
