PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

BELIEVING LEAVING....!

Jess was in Grade 7 back when Grade 7 was a part of Primary School! She was guite a bright student academically but struggled in the sporting arena and indeed most outdoor activities as she only had one arm. Her right arm was amputated just below the shoulder when she was in Grade 3 or 4 (not real sure) and so she had to train herself to write left-handed – amongst all the other things she had to conquer. The things she didn't do were mostly those things she was not allowed to do - and I wonder whether that was more to do with the fear factor from the School and indeed at times from her parents? She came with us on a school camp and she was assigned to me to look after her and make sure she was not picked on or bullied because of her limitations. All went well and we bonded quite strongly over the first 3 days of camp – she came on the hike – was helped to pitch her tent etc but generally she managed well. Then came day 4! Bouldering – or climbing up a manmade wall outside with just those little pegs to hang onto as you ascend. I suggested to Jess that she would need to sit this out! Not likely! She was so determined. I knew she would be harnessed in appropriately and so even if she missed one of the pegs (which to me seemed an obvious outcome) she would be safe enough – apart from her damaged pride maybe. So, she started! Remember only one arm, one hand! In order to navigate the climb she had to literally release her good hand and using her legs jump to the next peg and cling to it with her left hand. And then again and again... What a sight? I'll never forget my amazement and sense of pride as she conquered that wall. "Had you done that before?" I asked after she was safely down. "Never", she replied. Gobsmacked, I stuttered, "How?" "Well, she said, to move forward (meaning up) I knew I had to leave behind the security of clinging and believe that where I was heading was better than where I was."

Its never easy leaving our comforts and securities – what we know and are used to – to move forward to greater heights, new opportunities, new vision, new insights! Yet that is exactly what Jesus calls us to do! "Get up", He says, and walk – to the man crippled for some 38 years (John 5), Believe that what is ahead is better than what you are leaving. Believing leaving is not for the faint hearted – but it is for God's disciples! Shalom - Dave
