PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

INVITATIONAL LIVING...

I think we should do something different! This was the cry from a family committed to the Tallebudgera small church I pastored for nearly 10 years. Things seemed to be going OK but the traditional Sunday morning wasn't any longer attracting anyone. We seemed to have plateaued in numbers and in energy. Here was an invitation, I pondered. Different? I had not long come back from a week away on Fraser Island and Craig (one of my mates who came with me) taught me how to use a camp oven. (I wasn't that great at it but I did learn how to cook a pretty mean damper) on the open fire. Ummm - maybe that was it. Something completely different. We had the open space and even a sloped ground making sitting round a fire eating damper and telling stories - well, different! So after some conversations we started what we called 'Fireside Chat" on a Sunday afternoon once per month. I invited all the normal church folk but also a number of contacts from the local school and family members, suggesting that this was no church service—its outdoors and should be fun. I was dumbfounded. It became a hit and within a couple of months we had around 40 coming regularly. And about half of them were not churched. We had competitions as to who could make the best damper, always a hit and a focus of the night. We shared stories and just did life with these people. Several of these regular attenders became solid companions - would come to any church event , help out at working bees. Etc. We rarely saw them in the church building but they came to worship in a different way. Three ultimately gave their lives to Jesus and are still involved in different local churches on the Gold Coast. The power of invitation! Invitational living is about creating space - space for conversations, for developing friendships, for building bridges into community, yet equally about inviting others into your faith and discovering how you can be invited into their lives. Scripture is full of Jesus inviting others to be blessed like Zacchaeus (Luke 19), Nicodemus (John 3) are just 2 examples. How invitational are we? Shalom Dave
