### **PASTOR'S PONDERINGS**

### THE LENTEN LENS!

When I was about 24, I remember being told that by the time I got to 30, I would be totally bald and will need strong glasses as your eyes will be failing you! I recall being somewhat alarmed. Not so much over the loss of hair but certainly over the loss of 20/20 vision. Well, 3 decades on (I know I'm old) I still have some hair - not much though - and I still have reasonably good sight with no need for glasses yet! I am sure that time is coming! But not yet! I remember Dad saying something like - "Ummm interesting: I wonder what lens that guy was using to make such a statement? But son, the more important question is what lens are you using? Because if it's the right one, it won't matter what you may need to look through." As we commence our Lenten journey what lens are you using? I am a Rock and Water trained and accredited facilitator. Rock and Water is an activity based learning program devised by a Dutch School teacher, named Freek, who felt compelled to offer something different and more hands on for those young school students who just could not make it in 'normal school'. Freek was the one who trained us in his own program and he was always saying - "whatever you do, keep on task. It's all written down for you". Rock and Water has three main pillars upon which all else is framed. Focus, Centred and Grounded! Although not a Christian program, there are certainly Christian reflections throughout its curriculum. These 3 pillars for example could easily be attributed to Jesus and His teaching. "Keep your eyes focussed on me, avoid distractions taking you away from what is central to your well-being and remain grounded in my Word". Perhaps we could learn something from Freek as we check our Lenten Lens! Whatever you do, keep on task. It's written down. Interestingly, our Lenten journey starts in the wilderness as we 'see' Jesus being tempted. What are the 3 words Jesus uses each time to repel the temptation Satan was throwing at Him? IT IS WRITTEN. Lets stay on task for Jesus! Shalom.
